MINUTES

1. Opening/Apologies - Craig Lapsley

• Apologies from Russell McMurray DEDJTR and Michael Holloway was present in lieu.

2. MSAR Office Progress - Wes Oswin

Update included an overview of the following areas, and minutes from the last meeting were noted:

- Insurance
- Project Working Groups
- Interim Arrangements
- Geospatial mapping
- Business case update
- Funding options

Other updates included:

- TSV held a MDEMS consultation session on 27 September 2016 where two groups were formed to address technical and operational issues for the Marine Distress Emergency Monitoring System
- Wes and Craig attended the blessing of the fleet in Frankston which was a successful event
- The BSFP grant scheme planning is currently open and MSAR providers have been asked to contact the MSAR Office initially prior to making application.
- Wes was in Gippsland on Saturday to meet with the Gippsland squadron flotillas

3. Insurance developments

- Wes Oswin gave an overview of the progress with VMIA
- All survey data is now submitted and collated
- Have reached an agreement in principle with VMIA to provide insurance.
- The extent of the proposed insurance coverage was outlined
- Draft ministerial briefs and letters have been prepared, and VMIA and DTF are comfortable with the content
- The Finance and Insurance Working Group is being kept up-to-date with the progress
- Recommended that an application should be made to fund the scheme through the recently announced Emergency Services Volunteer Sustainability Grants Program
- This could potentially fund VMIA insurance for two years rather than one discussions ongoing with VMIA about this.
- The VIMA cover should result in some cost savings as well as more extensive and consistent insurance cover

4. Project Working Groups

- Project Groups are underway having already met twice this month
- The first round was via teleconferencing (during 4-6 October)
- Second meetings were face-to-face on Sunday 16 October for Training and Assessment and Risk and Capability. Finance and Insurance is scheduled for 25 October 2016 at Sandringham Coast Guard

Training and Assessment

- Doug King is coming on board to assist with the Training and Assessment work stream
- He will be reviewing all current training and assessment process and will report back to the Working Group to organise the next steps
- He will also be considering interstate and overseas training programs in this review

Risk and Capability

- Russell Rees facilitated this section and will be assisting with Risk and Capability workload
- Russell showed descriptors and flow charts of the methodology to be used to develop the capability strategy
- The TSV Vessel Report needs to be updated to include some missing assets
- MSAR capability maps will be distributed for the teleconference meetings in two weeks

5. Interim Arrangements

- Interim Arrangement have been delayed as some details needed to be clarified, with respect to vessel standards and AMSA EX24.
- The arrangements will be re-circulated to the Working Group
- A communique will be written and version control added.

6. Geospatial Mapping and Capability

- The MSAR units have been geocoded in a GIS
- This allows use in emergency management systems like EM-COP and EMAP WATER
- The geospatial mapping overlays capability data with marine incident data in different conditions
- Initial assessment indicates some capability gaps on the coast at Apollo Bay and in East Gippsland in moderate conditions. There would appear to be very good capability in fair conditions.
- Russell will investigate the human operation capability of each provider to match the conditions and assets

Things to consider:

- When there are incidents on the water, will we issue a warning?
- Is there a need to issue a warning?
- Need a consistent approach when warning communities
- Where will this information be captured? Does Victoria Police have the capacity?
- There does not appear to be processes around documenting calls
- Perhaps EMV-COP could be customised for use in MIR incident management?

Next steps:

· An overarching capability strategy to be developed

7. Business Case Development

- Business case is currently in final draft
- Will be meeting on Friday 21 October to review the case and will be completed by 2 November 2016
- Business case will be integrated into a separate business case being developed by DEDJTR.

8. Funding Options

- Wes discussed progress on a potential MSAR levy
- Wes has met with key stakeholders to gauge support
- All stakeholder agreed that sustainable funding for MSAR is necessary and there is broad support for the reform
- A Meeting is set for next week with DEDJTR to determine the direction to consider a sustainable funding option for the sector

9. Other Business

- The State Maritime Non-Search and Rescue Plan is being released
- There is a need to capture good data to analyse sector performance over time
- Discussion on the need for a policy to govern non-SAR fundraising activities in the sector vs commercial activity
